

Curved Piecing with Bias Strips by Jan Soules

Learn to design your own free form pattern and then join the pieces together using bias strips. Absolutely no curved piecing. We will work on a foundation.

No two quilts will be alike! Join us for a fun relaxing way to quilt.

Supply list:

- A variety of fabrics, fat quarters OK, great for batiks or prints
- 2- ½ yard pieces (or larger) for bias strips to coordinate with fabrics, or a few fat quarters
- Freezer paper, may pre cut one 18" square
- 4 gallon size zip lock bags
- Sulky Soft n 'Sheer, a stabilizer (roll or sheets) 3 yards (I have purchased it at JoAnn's and Shared Stitches sells it by the yard)

Note regarding Curved Piecing class in April: "It has come to my attention that the stabilizer I recommended for the class, Soft'N Sheer is no longer available in the area or very hard to find. I recommend any non woven stabilizer (non fusible), such as Pellon True Grid 810 or 820. Also Pellon Easy pattern #830 would work. These products are available at JoAnns." Jan Soules

- Bias makers ¼, ½, or ¾ (have at least 2 sizes)
- Rotary cutter, mat, ruler, pencil, paper scissors, plenty of pins
- Sewing machine with walking foot and ability to do zigzag stitching
- Thread for piecing and a variegated thread for the bias strips to coordinate with your fabrics
- Spray starch
