

MAKING FACES MATERIALS LIST

(and arms & hands, legs and feet, etc.)

To learn how to include people to your project, you will need:

- a color photo of the person you wish to create
- a black & white Xerox copy of your person, the exact size you want him or her to be in your quilt (Kinko's or home printer).
- a medium line black permanent pen and a pencil
- good quality colored pencils: dark blue, rose red, yellow, brown, tan, black, etc. - to match your person's skin tones (I like Caran d'Ache watercolor pencil Supracolor II #3888-159 for ethnic people, but lighter blue for light-skinned people)
- medium weight fusible interfacing to use as a foundation for your person (I like Pellon 808 Craft-Fuse, which has a smooth glue surface, NOT dots of glue. (You can purchase some from me in class)
- fine-line permanent markers such as Sharpies, especially black & brown
- tightly-woven cotton fabric - batiks work best because they're very finely woven (I use tan batik for ethnic faces)
- Lite Steam-A-Seam 2 or other paper-backed fusible
- Krylon spray fixative
- freezer paper
- a light box (if you have one - otherwise we can use a window)
- fabric for your person's clothing
